Cross-Border Cooperation is a traditional EU instrument aimed at reinforcing cooperation between institutions in border regions of the neighboring countries by providing financial assistance. These programmes facilitate cooperation between border areas of neighboring states (cross-border cooperation) or cooperation of parts and/or entire states (transnational cooperation) in solving issues of common interest such as waste management, service provision in various sectors, cultural and economy cooperation, tourism , transport.

BRAINSTORMING: FROM IDEA TO PROJECT PROPOSAL


Introduction/Need Analysis: Climate change causes numerous occurrences of extreme weather events, placing many cities at increased risk of flooding. Since 2000, floods have caused at least 950 deaths, the displacement of more than 500000 people and at least 30000 MEUR in insured economic losses, only in Europe. In addition to the influence on biological and ecological conditions and the consequences of use of agricultural land, one of the major risks to human health and animals' life is the transfer of toxicants via the food chain (Figure 1.1).



With progress of our society, especially with

industrialization process, concentrations of heavy metals (HMs) in environment increased dramatically, causing many negative effects on living organisms (humans, animals, plants). Floods can be one of the causes for increasing concentrations of HMs in natural environment. HMs can be classified in terms of their toxicity: very toxic (mercury, cadmium, lead, arsenic, selenium) and moderately toxic (zinc, copper, tin, etc.). Figure 1.1. Risks after floods Higher concentrations of HMs in environment lead to catastrophic consequences on ecosystem. They are very harmful, because metals cannot be degraded and are accumulated in living tissues. Therefore, metal pollution is still one of the most critical environmental issues.


BRAINSTORMING: FROM IDEA TO PROJECT PROPOSAL



Key rules

- Project objectives (one general and 3-5 specific) should be clear, realistic, measurable and achievable
- Activities should be credible
- Institutions should have sufficient capacity (human resources, lacksquarefinancial resources, infrastructure, etc.)
- Activity and budget alignment is necessary •

PROJECT IDEA GENERATION

- This is the time when an idea is being shared among potential partners until the moment it becomes clear that the project is necessary and relevant to the improvement of a certain condition in the programme area.
- To establish the need for a project.
- To establish the baseline; i.e., what has already been carried out and how we capitalise on this.
- To start the search and involvement of partners.
- To outline the scope and content of the project.
- To test the project idea relevance through research, possible pilot activities and the involvement of key stakeholders.
- To contact the programme and check if the project idea fits the programme strategy and requirements.

PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

During this stage partners consolidate the idea into a concrete Project proposal, by defining the strategic and operational details as well as the responsibilities among partners. At the end of this stage the application form is submitted to the programme.





INSTRUCTIONS

Call for proposal refers to specific document «Guidelines for grant applicants» and its annexes are the basis for review and reference for this specific call when applying for a grant scheme.

The grant guideline with its annexes provides information on the subject of the grant, explaining the rationale and purpose of the grant call.

This is the reference document providing basic information and guidance to the applicants such as procedure and requirements for submission.

Grant Contract Format, General Conditions, Legal Identity Form, Financial Identification Form are some of the documents in the annexes that the applicant is given.

WHILE THE PROJECT IS UNDERWAY, EU REGULATIONS REQUIRE YOU TO:

Provide a catchy description on your website, if you have one, highlighting the EU support

Place a poster of at least A3 size with relevant information about your project, including the financial support of the EU, in a visible spot

If your project is cofunded by the European Social Fund, and in appropriate cases by the European Regional Development Fund or Cohesion Fund, make sure all people involved are aware of the EU support. For instance, if you are giving a training session the material or certificate provided to participants should include a reference to the EU support

If the cost of your project exceeds EUR 500,000 and involves the purchase of a physical object or the financing of infrastructure or of construction operations, place a temporary billboard of proportionate size in a visible spot

- Integrate the SSH dimension in the proposal from the very beginning of the design cycle
- If consortium based proposal -> include specific expertise .
- Foresee specific activities in the workplan and related results/deliverables
- Societal impact must be explicitly described as well

A proposal without a sufficient contribution/integration of SSH will receive a low evaluation score

What is assessed? - Clear and straight forward management structure (a diagram can be useful) - Role, composition, interactions of the different bodies - If there is an Advisory Body – composition (even if not definitive, and not necessarily the names of the members but the sectors/fields represented), role, and how it will be involved should be explained - Outline of the decision making rules, the conflict resolution rules even though they are going to be elaborated in the CA.


